Restart Scouting Checklist

Getting Parents Involved - Discussion

Things to Avoid – Assumptions

- Prior knowledge of your Unit / Position / Activities / Scout Jargon
- Coming to you
- Ability and Willingness to Serve

Getting Parents Involved - Discussion

Parent Orientation – Planning

- Know what your Unit needs
 - How? Assessments (HINT UC can help)
 - Understand that need (Title, Task, Time)
 - Document that need (sticky note idea)

Getting Parents Involved - Discussion

Parent Orientation – Planning

- Contacting people individually
- Have an Agenda (share if possible)
- Preselect my.scouting or other courses/videos/tools that can help

Getting Parents Involved - Discussion

Parent Orientation – During

- Use the Agenda
- Address the Prior Knowledge Assumptions
- Distribute the Tasks
- DOCUMENT who took the task
- Leave time for Q&A

Getting Parents Involved - Discussion

Parent Orientation – AFTER

- Follow-up – Individually, Regularly
- Provide Training and Resources
- Provide ability to swap tasks
- “Praise in public, coach in private”
